### 6. REVALIDATION

The rationale for this request was as follows:

The request for extensions of validation comes in the context of imminent regulation under CORU, the health and social care professional regulator. One specific aim of the College is to ensure the revalidation of these programmes would also be aligned with the CORU requirements/education standards which are yet to be released. IICP College is considering proposed changes to the

programmes based on the evidence they have gathered from stakeholders. The College is seeking to have an extension of an additional year to allow the programme team to conduct its review and submit a validation that is informed by the CORU education standards.

The rationale for this request was as follows:

For the Applied Management programmes, the central rationale for this extension request relates to allowing for the publication of, and subsequent measurement against, the statutory online learning guidelines, which are scheduled to be available over the next year.

For the Contemporary Disability programme, the College would like to further investigate the continuing viability of this programme over the next year, while continuing to offer some of the more popular minor awards which are attached to this programme. Other Minor and Special Purpose awards included in this suite will be allowed to lapse at the end of the current validation period, as they have been found not to be commercially sustainable, and the College has notified QQI of this intention.

For the Certificate in Supported Employment, the College hopes to extend this programme to align its revalidation process with OTC's other Social Care Programmes which are due for revalidation in the next academic year.

The Committee APPROVED the request to extend the last intake date of the programmes above to September 2023 and August 2024 respectively.

An extension of the programmes validation of one year would facilitate the further development and review of teaching practices, recording of performances by clients and associated learning outcomes achieved that are necessary for the complete review.

However, FIT intends to agree on the Terms of Reference with QQI and undertake this activity commencing in June 2023. FIT is requesting an extension for the programme until April 2024, this will allow for an active intake through the calendar year 2023. FIT expects to complete the programme review in the latter months of 2023.

The Committee APPROVED the request to extend the last intake date of the programme above to April 2024.

Sourcing the required expertise has proven particularly challenging as it currently does not exist in Ireland. Additionally, analysis of the revalidation research has highlighted the need for several significant changes to be made to the programme content, learning outcomes and assessments. Each of these changes must undergo a series of reviews by subject matter experts, peers, quality assurance and technology enhanced learning personnel. When the review process has been completed and amendments have been signed off for implementation, several stakeholder groups will be impacted.

LCETB is requesting an extension for the programme until March 2024, this will allow for an active intake through the calendar year 2023. LCETB expects to complete the programme review in the latter months of 2023.

The Committee APPROVED the request to extend the last intake date of the programme above to March 2024.
